SCRIPTURE READING
Romans 8:4b-13 (CEB)

Now the way we live is based on the Spirit, not based on selfishness. People whose lives are based on selfishness think about selfish things, but people whose lives are based on the Spirit think about things that are related to the Spirit. The attitude that comes from selfishness leads to death, but the attitude that comes from the Spirit leads to life and peace. So the attitude that comes from selfishness is hostile to God. It doesn't submit to God's Law, because it can't. People who are self-centered aren't able to please God.

But you aren't self-centered. Instead, you are in the Spirit, if in fact God's Spirit lives in you. If anyone doesn't have the Spirit of Christ, they don't belong to him. If Christ is in you, the Spirit is your life because of God's righteousness, but the body is dead because of sin. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your human bodies also, through his Spirit that lives in you.

So then, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation, but it isn't an obligation to ourselves to live our lives on the basis of selfishness. If you live on the basis of selfishness, you are going to die. But if by the Spirit you put to death the actions of the body, you will live.

About Jim Harnish



Jim graduated from Asbury College with a B.A. degree, Asbury Theological Seminary with a M.Div. degree and has received honorary doctoral degrees from Asbury Theological Seminary-Orlando and Bethune-Cookman University.

A native of Pennsylvania, he “married into” Florida when he married his wife Marsha, who is a native of St. Petersburg. They have two daughters and two grandchildren.

He served Florida churches in DeLand, Crescent City, was the founding pastor of St. Luke’s UMC in Orlando before his appointment to serve Hyde Park UMC in Tampa from 1992 until his retirement in 2014. He served churches in the Florida Annual Conference for 42 years.

He has written more than 20 books and Bible studies and numerous articles for magazines and online media including www.jimharnish.org.

Harnish was elected as a delegate to each Jurisdictional and General Conference since 1980 and represented Florida at the World Methodist Conferences in Nairobi, Kenya; Rio de Janeiro, Brazil and Brighton, England. He says the most important thing he does is “lift the vision of God’s call on the life of this church, preach the Word, and be faithful in prayer.”

He enjoys Beethoven or contemporary praise music depending on how he feels and what he needs and still wonders if there has been any “good” music since Peter, Paul and Mary. His favorite movies are “To Kill a Mockingbird” and “Seabiscuit” and loves to watch reruns of “M*A*S*H” or early seasons of “The West Wing.” His favorite food is seafood. He spends his free time reading, walking, cheering for the Gators, relaxing by the lake.

In 2018, Jim and Martha now live in Longwood, Florida, where Jim continues writing for the United Methodist Publishing House (Cokesbury), doing some teaching and preaching, and leading the Institute of Preaching at Duke Divinity School.

Martha and Jim have two daughters. Carrie Lynn is married to Andy, and they live in Orlando with their grandchildren Julia, Alex and Luke. Deborah Jeanne is married to Dan, and they live in Charleston, South Carolina, with their two granddaughters, Mattie, and Molly.
