### Sign Up to Serve in the Pumpkin Patch

Our first delivery of pumpkins for the season is on Saturday, October 5. Our annual Pumpkin Patch will be open from October 5 through October 31 or until the last pumpkin is sold!

We need your help to unload the pumpkins and staff the patch for the month. You can sign up for your shifts online at <u>clearviewumc.org/pumpkins</u>. Like last year, we are using an online-only volunteer sign-up. We will have some computers set up in the East Wing for you to use before or after worship. There will be people around who can assist you if you need some help. You can also contact the Church Office for assistance or grab a tech-savvy friend or family member.

The Pumpkin Patch will be open on Weekdays 3-8 pm, Saturdays 9 am-8 pm, and Sundays Noon-8 pm. We need cashiers, pumpkin pricers, greeters, pumpkin turners, and food sellers. There is a place for everyone to serve, no matter your age or ability. Come hang out in the patch and share the love of God with our community!

### The Free Little Pantries Need Our Help!

The need is far greater than the speed with which we can fill the pantries. You have seen lists so you know what types of foods are most helpful but remember that the homeless cannot cook so pop-top cans of meat/protein items, peanut butter or cheese crackers, breakfast bars (soft & crunchy), trail mix, fruit cups or cans are especially helpful. BOGO purchases can save you or double your donations. The St. Petersburg area has the highest homeless rate in the nation, according to the National Alliance to End Homelessness. **Our area has approximately 16,000 homeless and about one-fifth of them are children.** 

### **Supper Clubs**

We had a wonderful time with our Supper Clubs in the spring. Given the current busyness with Pumpkin Patch and Hurricane Helene recovery efforts, Supper Clubs will return in January 2025. You will have the opportunity to sign up for one at this time.
