DEVOTIONS

GATHERING

♣ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

Creator of all, open our hearts and minds to learn new things. Give us the courage and openness to be willing to change as you lead us—all to your glory! Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- **Highs and Lows:** What is something that made you feel calm today? What made you feel stressed?
- Thinking about This Week's Story: In this week's reading, a man from Ethiopia was excited to learn something new about God. What was something that you learned today?
- Getting Ready for Next Week's Story: In next week's Scripture, the early church leaders argued. What was an argument or disagreement you had today? How did you resolve it?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

♣ Spend a moment to think about who you can show God's love to. Pray for them and for one another to encourage everyone to take initiative this week.

CLOSING

₱ If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.
